
You may notice that the publication looks different to previous years. We have worked with a new designer to help modernise our brand, introducing new graphics and symbols for our three core pillars of work:

Communities of Interest (COIs)

Are you already a member of one of MU's Communities of Interest? Member forums on membership, communications, domestic abuse, AFIA, prisons work, fundraising, database, governance, safeguarding – there is a lot to choose from!

Each COI should have at least one representative from every diocese and meets 2-4 times a year on Zoom to share ideas and success stories with fellow members and to guide MSH in their work.

A couple of COIs to spotlight are Membership and Crafting:

Membership COI:

This new COI has met 3 times and is focused on sharing and learning from each other about what is working in branches and dioceses to sustain and grow membership. Currently focusing on how to revive branches and alternative ways to structure branches, meetings, and groups to optimise participation, volunteering and to encourage new members. Did you know branches do not need formal positions of leaders, secretaries, and treasurers? Did you know you can meet as fellowship or prayer groups in the evening or online? Did you know that member subscriptions can be paid directly to dioceses?

This COI is looking at how membership can grow locally and how MSH can fill in the gaps with new initiatives targeting new audiences with different membership options like supporter, gifts of MU and church-based memberships.

Working together, members and MSH are focused on finding ways to support each other to help sustain and grow the movement.
